# The Post-Egypt Paradigm Shift

## The Disease of Egypt

400 years of having humanity and property stripped away.

A culture where nothing belonged to the laborer.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment is a built-in protection against mistreating others—a reminder not to treat others others the way you were treated in Egypt.

## The Cure of Sinai

God reintroduces a framework of personal agency and ownership.

Establishing a vital new societal rule: “What’s yours is yours, and what’s mine is mine.”

# The Etymology Matrix: **Ganav**

גנב

The Hebrew word *Ganav* (pronounced with a 'v') translates literally to 'thief,' but its implications govern all forms of unjust acquisition.

## Property Theft

To steal, carry away, or secretly bring.

## Deception

To acquire deceptively, to get by stealth, or to defraud someone of their rightful wages.

## Human Theft

To kidnap, traffic, or strip another person of their autonomy.

# The Ultimate Theft: Stealing God's Workmanship

In order to justify slavery, a society must first agree that a human being is property.



**Exodus 21:16** dictates strict judgment for kidnapping and selling a human being.

**'If you didn't make me, you can't take me.'** God does not, has not, and will never condone slavery or human trafficking because human life is God's exclusive property.

# The Principle of Borrowed Possessions



## Physical Trust

Based on Exodus 22:7. If you are entrusted with a neighbor's property (e.g., a prized East Indian mango tree), you are responsible for it as if it were your own. Negligence is equated to theft.



## Spiritual Trust

Parents, grandparents, and the church family must realize that children are only 'borrowed possessions' from God. We cannot allow the enemy to sneak in, snatch them, and destroy them.

**Stewardship is the active defense against theft.**

# The Root Cause Matrix (1 Timothy 6:10)

## Money / Accumulating Wealth

Nature: A neutral tool.

Biblical Stance: Acceptable. God is not against striving to better yourself, becoming a CEO, or earning a high salary.

Result: Can be used to provide, build, and bless others.

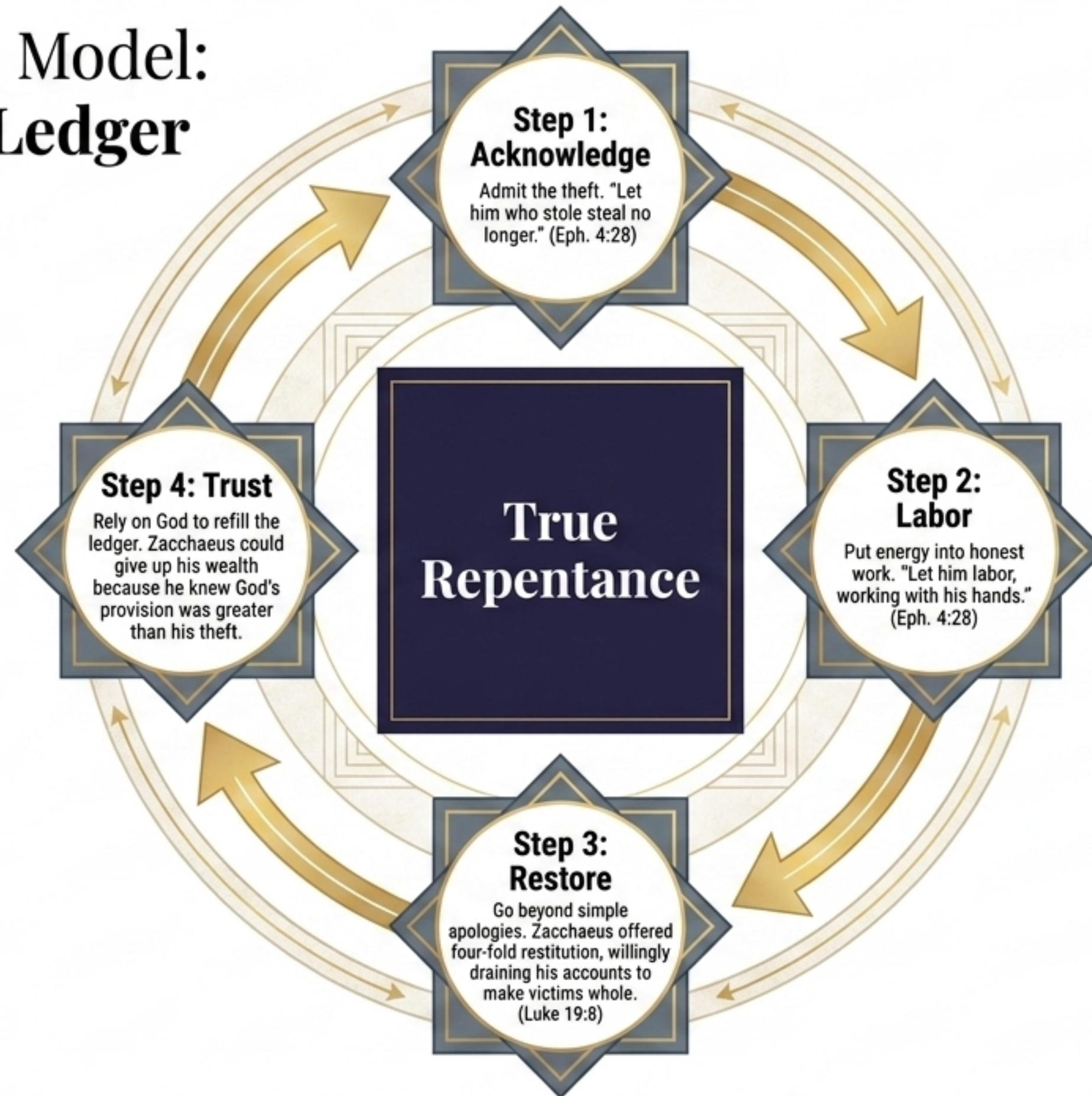
## The Love of Money

Nature: An idol and a gateway drug.

Biblical Stance: The root of all kinds of evil.

Result: Leads to exploitation, canceling employee benefits for executive bonuses, international resource wars, and stepping on others to get ahead.

# The Divine Ledger: How Do We Rob God?

“Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed Me! But you say, ‘In what way have we robbed You?’ In tithes and offerings.” (Malachi 3:8)

## Maser (The Tithe)

- **Definition:** 10% of all increase.
- **Nature:** An obligation. It is owed back to God unquestioned.

## Teruma (The Offering)

- **Definition:** A present, a sacrifice, or a tribute.
- **Nature:** A freewill gift given not from what is left over, but given out of recognition of who God is.

Tithes and offerings do not go “to the church”—they go back to God, who uses them to fund ministry and bless the giver.

## **The Synthesis: Why Do We Steal?**

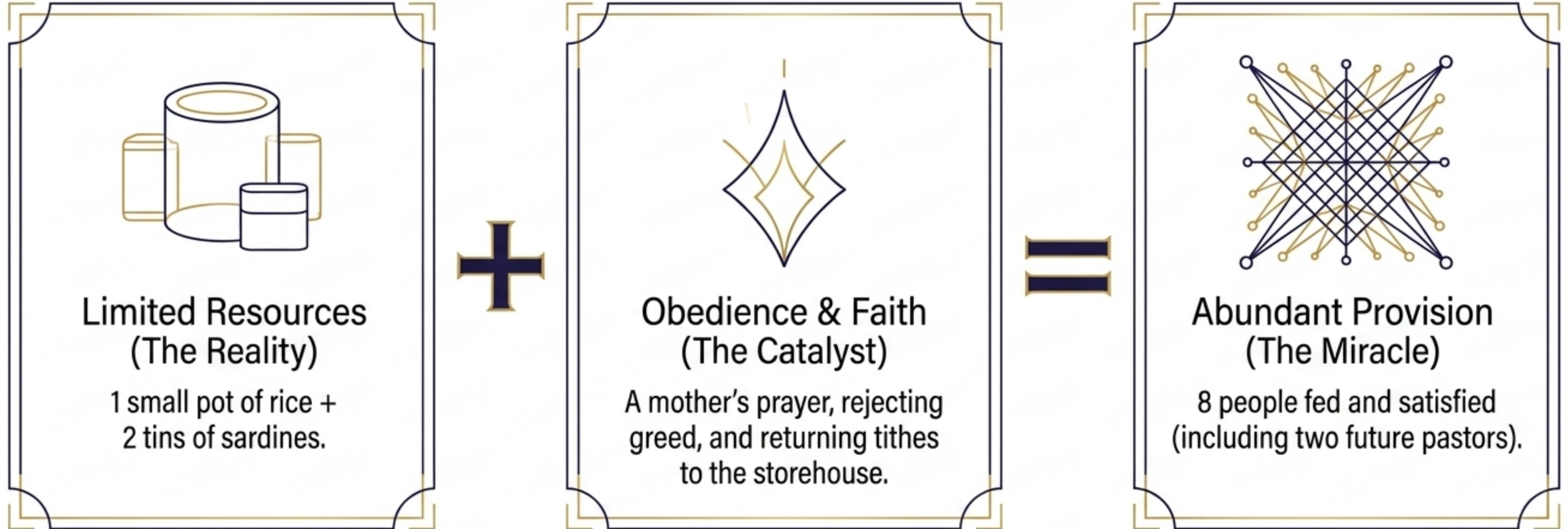
**We steal—whether from our employer, our neighbor, or our God—because we operate from a mindset of scarcity. We steal when we believe there is not enough, and that God will not provide.**

**The ultimate antidote to the 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment is radical trust in God.**

When you prioritize the Kingdom (“Seek ye first...”), God may not make you a millionaire, but your bread and water will be sure.

Trust removes the panic that causes theft.

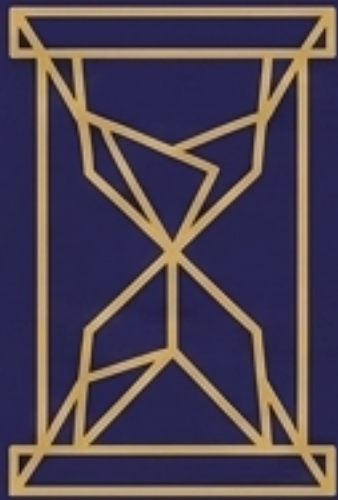
# The Storehouse Multiplier (Malachi 3:10)

# Stewardship of Time (Psalm 90:12)

## The Scarcity Mindset

"Living as though days are numbered."

Characteristics: Doom, gloom, panic, and a rocky road.

Result: Leads to rushing, greed, and taking what isn't yours because time is running out.

## The Stewardship Mindset

"Numbering our days."

Characteristics: Counting blessings. "This is the first day God blessed me, the hundredth day, the thousandth day..."

Result: A circumspect life, redeeming the time because the days are evil. (Ephesians 5:15-16)

# Stewardship of Treasure (Deut. 8:17-18)

## The Illusion of Self

"My power and the might of my hand have gained me this wealth."

Vulnerable to moth, rust, and thieves.



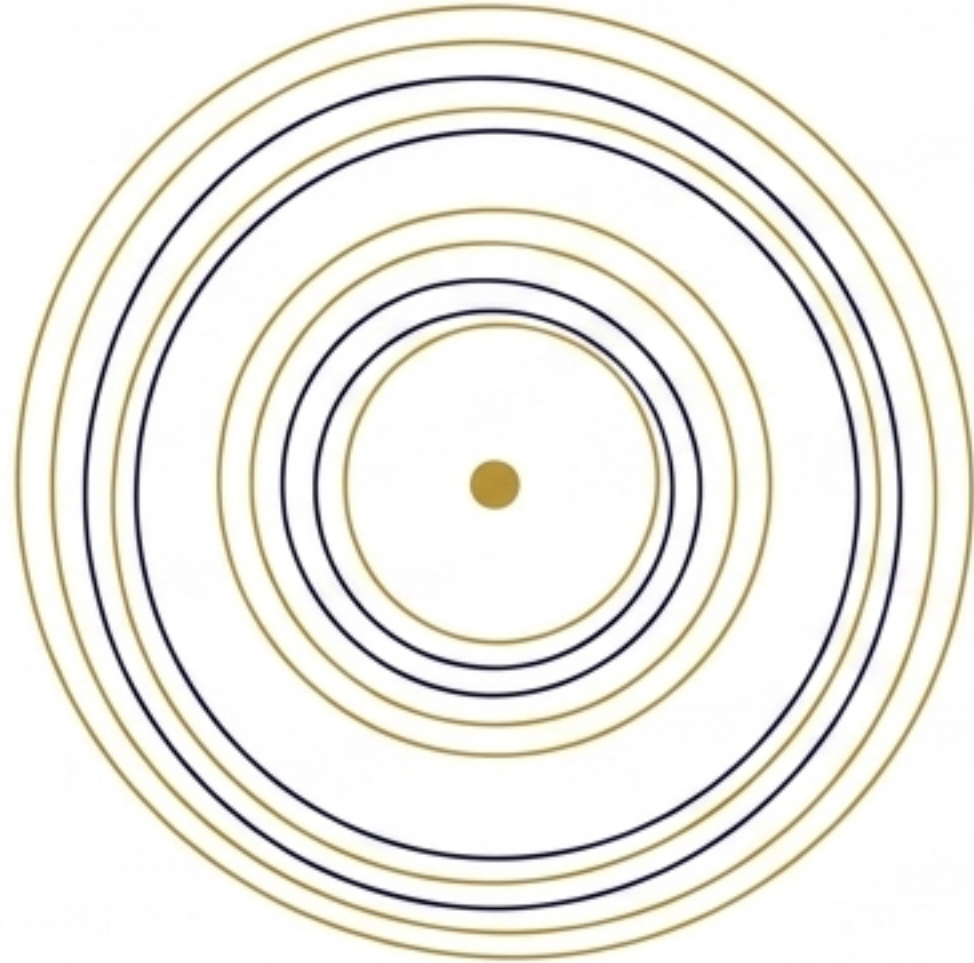
## The Reality of Grace

"It is He who gives you power to get wealth."  
God cares not about our education or skills; every blessing is a gift from Him.

Stored in heaven, secure from theft.

Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. You cannot serve God and Mammon (Money).

# Stewardship of Talents (Galatians 6:9-10)



**Core Concept:** God placed man in the garden to “tend and keep it.” Our talents are meant to cultivate our environment.

**The Rule of the Family:** “Let us do good to all, especially to those of the household of faith.” We cannot treat strangers better than our own family.

## The Metaphor

Just like a father telling his children: “Behave yourself. You carry my name. You leave together, and you come back together.” When the enemy attacks a brother or sister, we do not abandon them; we band together in prayer and protect the family name of Christ.

## The Ultimate Choice

**Will you rob God of

bless you abundantly?**

The 8th Commandment is not just about keeping your hands out of your neighbor's pockets. It is an invitation to stop fighting for scraps in a broken economy, and start trusting implicitly in the unlimited ledger of God.
